

Missing Persons presents a week of art and fashion 1–7 December 2021

From December 1–7, Missing Persons celebrates the emerging practice of 'art to wear' with six Melbourne artists launching a collection of one-off collectable garments in a succession of quick turnaround exhibitions.

While enduring one of the longest lockdowns in the world, these independent artists were inspired to create wearable art that feeds off the global social media trend of reusing and upcycling fashion.



Repurposing garments frees these artists to exploit the traditional mindset of the fashion designer and consumer.

Younger generations are demanding more sustainable art and fashion practices and ARTWEAR FESTIVAL embraces a return to DIY ethics and techniques - through art with independence and flare.

The eclectic mix of Melbourne artists, who each have their own unique style, creates a grassroots feel to Missing Persons. Each quick-turnaround exhibition features upcycled, reworked, patched, painted, printed, stained, dyed and bleached pieces with a punk aesthetic and sensibility.

The festival program is curated by Louise Klerks who said:

"The concept stemmed from a growing community interest in artist-made clothing. *Is this art or is it fashion?* ARTWEAR is dedicated to achieving an amalgamation of both, diffusing the boundaries of these creative industries."

"The public can purchase unseen garments directly from the makers and be part of a growing community dedicated to conscious consumption and sustainable fashion."
